MINUTES¹ UNIVERSITY SENATES CONFERENCE

Professor Langley, Chair, called the University Senates Conference to order at 10:00 a.m.

I. Executive Session

II. Guest

Dr. Frances Carroll, member of the U of I Board of Trustees, told the Conference that she has enjoyed being a part of the University of Illinois since her appointment began in May 2003. The past ten years she has been principal of an alternative school in Cook County. She has been a teacher and administrator in Chicago public schools and has taught at universities in the Chicago area. She started the Carroll Family Foundation, which provides scholarships.

Dr. Carroll commented that she was aware of the Chief Illiniwek issue prior to her joining the Board. After becoming more orientated to the issue, she felt that it was time to retire the Chief, as did other members of the Board. The issue has taken very much time away from other important University matters and has caused much damage to the Urbana campus. Conference members told of incidents where faculty and graduate students have chosen not to come to the U of I because of Chief Illiniwek. The Conference told Dr. Carroll that the 1998 UIUC Senate resolution to retire the Chief would be sent to the Board office for distribution to the trustees, since the resolution precedes many of the trustees' terms. Dr. Carroll acknowledged that the forthcoming departures of the President and the UIUC Chancellor might reprioritize the timing of the Chief issue.

Dr. Carroll believes that there should be shared governance in conducting searches. Faculty

should be involved in the process and in the selection. Conference members shared their view that an academic president is needed.

The Conference informed Dr. Carroll that the faculty, through the senates and the Senates Conference, has tried to get a voice without vote at the Board table for some time now. Faculty would also like to have representation, such as a liaison, on the Board's Academic Affairs Committee. Dr. Carroll did not realize that there were no faculty members on the Academic Affairs Committee and said that she would look into it.

The members of the Conference thanked Dr. Carroll for meeting with them.

IV. Classification of Senate Minutes

The "N" is preceded by and followed by a lower case letter(s); c = Chicago; s = Springfield; u = Urbana-Champaign; usc = University Senates Conference. Example: "cNs,u" means that a matter has come up in the Chicago Senate, which may be of interest to Springfield and Urbana-Champaign.

V. Old Business – Action Items

1. OT-205. Presidential Search.

Professor Langley said that she and Professors Grossman and Strom had been discussing with Trustee Eppley the proposed composition of the Consultative Committee to Assist in the Selection of a President. The end result will be a committee with fewer faculty and more alumni members than the Conference recommended.

The Conference caucused by campus to discuss the faculty nominees recommended by the senates to serve on the consultative committee. Each group determined a recommended list and an alternate list of names for the faculty positions from their own campuses, which came to a total of sixteen names for eight positions. Each group also recommended one person who would be qualified to serve as chair or vice-chair of the committee.

Professor Langley said that it would be crucial for the consultative committee to determine the appropriate criteria for the presidential position, adding that faculty would need to have a strong voice.
