The Conference discussed USC membership issues such as attendance, temporarily replacing members, and the recalculation of apportionment to each campus.

#### VI. Old Business – Information and Discussion Items

#### 1. OT-227. The Global Campus.

Bodenhorn commented that the UIS Senate would be developing and considering a statement on the Global Campus similar to that of the UIUC Senate's statement.

The Conference discussed President White's and Chet Gardner's views on partnering with other institutions. Schacht proposed that the Conference adopt the UIUC Senate's advice on the Global Campus. The Conference decided to transmit the advice with some modifications, including a recommendation that there be an impact study and strengthening the language on partnering with other institutions.

The Conference recessed from the business meeting for lunch and a discussion with Trustee David Dorris

#### VII. Guest

Trustee Dorris commented that the University has served as a ladder for people to succeed. If the University begins acting more like a private institution, a lot of talent will not get tapped into.

Trustee Dorris commented on the Global Campus. The University has been a leader in education. Others have tried to do online education without the quality and genius that

make our campuses. He agrees with the overall philosophy of the Global Campus and believes that uncertainty should not deter the initiative. He said that the faculty have the credibility and expertise to advise and help shape the Global Campus. Conference members expressed some of their concerns. Trustee Dorris replied that the leaders need to listen to the experts. Stress and conflict will help shape a better product.

Trustee Dorris discussed his views on the Chief Illiniwek controversy. He is not concerned with symbols, but rather with discrimination. He does not believe that the Chief is hostile or abusive. The tradition should be about the spirit of the Illini and the University family. Trustee Dorris commented that the way the decision was made is politically concerning. He also thought that there should have been an indication of plans for the future before the use of the Chief was discontinued.

Trustee Dorris was asked his opinion of how trustees should be selected. He responded that he believes there should be some sort of procedure where there is University involvement.

Bodenhorn thanked Trustee Dorris for meeting with the Conference.

The business meeting resumed at 2:10 p.m.

Schacht reviewed the proposals that had been mentioned earlier for the USC advice statement and read his proposed wording. By voice vote, the Conference agreed on what would go into the document. The Conference decided to send the document to the President with the request that he transmit it to the Board of Trustees.

Bodenhorn said that the Conference would have the opportunity to interview the final two candidates for Vice President for Academic Affairs soon. The Conference decided to develop a list of questions beforehand.

Professor Bodenhorn mentioned that the proposed revisions to *The General Rules* would be going to the Board next month. The Conflict of Commitment and Interest document is still under review

Schacht commented that the policy is a way of conforming to state law. No new language would be added. Bodenhorn said that this item would be put on the agenda for further discussion with the President at the next meeting.
