Professor Langley, Chair, called the University Senates Conference to order at 10:00 a.m.

II. Guest

Trustee Robert Vickrey discussed some of the important qualifications that he felt the next president should have. He also described the process that led to the hiring of the search firm to be used in the selection process. Conference members commented on important qualities that a successful candidate should have, such as a strong academic background and the ability to determine the appropriate vision and carry it out. The next president should also be able to raise funds for the University, have good media skills, and be comfortable in the governmental settings of the state capital and in Washington D.C.

The group discussed ways that the Chief Illiniwek controversy might impact the searches for a president and a chancellor.

Trustee Vickrey said that he is supportive of the University's program that covers the gap between MAP awards and actual tuition costs, but would like to see funding come from somewhere besides the tuition income fund. He commented that there are scholarships that go unused each year.

Professor Langley thanked Trustee Vickrey for meeting with the Conference and the Conference responded with a round of applause.
