Professor Ford moved to transmit the approved document to the President. The motion was seconded, voted on, and approved. Professor W. Jones mentioned that the UIC Senate had some concern with the integrity of e-mail. Professor Strom added that, while the University technically owns e-mail, the Senate felt that the University should tell employees if their e-mail will be viewed and there should be a policy as such. The Conference decided to consider the issue by first finding out if the campuses have policies regarding e-mail. Professor Kaufman mentioned that the FBI regularly comes to the campuses and gets information on foreign students. He asked if this policy would have an effect on how the FBI obtains information. It was not clear whether this was done under the Homeland Security Act. Professor Langley asked Professor Kaufman to find out more information about what and how information is obtained.

Professor Ford commented that the UIS administration has acted unilaterally, making decisions without going through a shared governance process. Professor Langley commented on a specific incident concerning an on-line teaching grant where important academic decisions were made without faculty input.
