MINUTES¹ UNIVERSITY SENATES CONFERENCE

Professor Gerald Strom, Chair, called the University Senates Conference to order at 10:00 a.m.

I. Executive Session

II. <u>Guest – Vice President David Chicoine</u>

Vice President Chicoine provided handouts to update the Conference on economic development activities. He said that out of the 700 previously-backlogged disclosures at UIUC, 150 have been actively marketed. The University should be starting about twenty companies a year. Over the last ten years, 120 companies have been started that are University-related but, of these, only thirty-five are actually licensed by the U of I.

Vice President Chicoine said that IllinoisVENTURES was established to accelerate the development of companies based on University technology by providing mentoring and business expertise. One goal is to provide some seed funds for start-up companies. Vice President Chicoine said that he has been spending a lot of time building relations with the private sector.

Vice President Chicoine told the Conference that the Chicago Technology Park is all commercialized. Half of the space at the Research Park at the Urbana campus is leased by private firms. The "Z" Building is completely occupied and the "I" Building is close to 100% occupancy. A third multi-tenant building is under construction.

There are Campus Entrepreneurial Education Programs at both UIC and UIUC. The University takes an equity position in new companies. The revenue flow is divided up

40% to the campus, 40% to the inventor(s), and 20% to the unit of the inventor(s). There has been a lag in revenue flow from inventions. Professor Conry said that he thought there needed to be a plan to invest some of the funds from royalties into a central endowment that would provide seed funds to support research. Vice President Chicoine said that the plan is for IllinoisVENTURES to sustain its own entity.

Professor Strom thanked Vice President Chicoine for meeting with the Conference.

IV. Old Business - Action Items

1. OT-89. Fitness to Work. Passed UIUC Senate 2/24/97. Passed UIC Senate 4/23/98. Passed UIS Senate 9/24/99.

Professor Kaufman reviewed the updated document that he drafted, which incorporated the changes proposed at the June 24 USC meeting. He first noted the change in the title of the document, *Evaluation of Ability to Work*, saying that this was appropriate because the purpose of the document is to establish procedures for the evaluation of an employee's ability to work.

Professor Fossum recommended adding "(ADA)" in Section II, first sentence, after "Americans with Disabilities Act," as an editorial change.

Professor Kaufman said that the Conference had added a sentence in Section III to emphasize that this was not a procedure to be used against the faculty in cases that infringe upon certain rights, such as academic freedom.

Professor Kaufman then turned to Section VI, 2, second paragraph, in which the selection of the Coordinator is defined. The Conference reconsidered the language suggested at the June meeting and changed the second sentence to read, "In each case, the Coordinator and the employee being evaluated will be in the same employment category (faculty, academic professional, staff)." The Conference then added an additional sentence to follow that read, "The process will be consistent with the rules of employment from that category."

The Conference discussed the last sentence of Section VI, 2.e. and reworded it to read,

"The results of a second evaluation may be provided at the employee's expense."

Professor Herricks expressed concern that the language about the selection of the Coordinator might not achieve the Conference's intention of having a Coordinator that will have the faculty member's best interest in mind. The Conference decided that the new language should be adequate, especially since the Coordinator does not have any decision-making responsibility.

The Conference decided to take out the words "involved in" under Section III, third sentence.

Professor Kaufman moved approval of *Evaluation of Ability to Work* as amended. The motion was seconded, voted on, and approved. The Conference decided that the document should be forwarded to the senates for action but not amendment.
