# MINUTES<sup>1</sup> UNIVERSITY SENATES CONFERENCE

Professor Strom, Chair, called the University Senates Conference to order at 10:00 a.m.

I. Executive Session

## II. <u>Guest – Vice Chancellor Charles Rice</u>

Vice Chancellor Rice discussed changes that have taken place over the last few years in the hospital.

Professor Strom asked what turned the financial situation around for the hospital, when only a few years ago the hospital was not doing well. Vice Chancellor Rice responded that the hospital did not do a good job of bill collecting and managing supplies costs, and had to use agency nurses when there was an adversarial relationship with the nursing staff. A university-related business has been set up to operate the billing process. The relationship with the nursing staff has improved greatly. The hospital has a much lower vacancy rate of nurses than the rest of the city and turnover is low. The hospital is managed more efficiently.

Vice Chancellor Rice said that implementing UI-Integrate will be a challenge. However, patient records and billing will not be part of the system.

Vice Chancellor Rice talked about some of the major issues facing health affairs. The health system is in crisis, especially for the care of the uninsured. Medicaid cutbacks have hurt the hospital and clinics. The cost of drugs keeps rising. There are shortages in the workforce. Because of these vulnerabilities, the medical center needs to reduce costs and grow strategically in some areas.

#### VI. New Business

1. OT-195. Process of the IBHE Big Picture Meeting.

Professor Fossum said that, at the last meeting, he had raised the question of whether a representative from USC should attend the IBHE Big Picture meeting as an official observer. Professor Strom suggested that the President be asked if this body could have an official observer at the IBHE Big Picture meeting. Professor Chambers so moved. The motion was seconded. Professor Kaufman suggested that each senate have an observer at the meeting. Professor Fossum said that each campus should ask on its own. He suggested that USC request that the chair or the chair's designee attend the IBHE Big Picture meeting as an official observer. The motion was approved.

- VII. Old Business Information and Discussion Items
  - 2. OT-123. Discussion of University Senates Conference guests.

The Conference discussed possible guests to invite to future meetings.

3. Campus Updates.

Professor Fossum said that the new vice chancellor position at UIUC almost did not go through the normal procedure, which is for the chancellor to obtain advice from the senate. The Senate Executive Committee met and approved the position and appointment before being approved by the Board of Trustees. Professor Fossum also told the Conference that items referred to the Senate by USC are in committee, including the *Interim Information Technology Policy*.

Professor Langley said that the interim policy was referred to the Academic Technology Committee of the UIS Senate. She also reported that the Senate passed the *Interim Code of Conduct* with the proposed change recommended by the UIUC Senate. An amendment was made to the preamble stating that there were no new sanctions created by the policy.

Professor Jones said that the UIC Provost is considering changes to the organization of his

office and has asked for comments from the UIC Senate.

5. OT-187. UI-Integrate/Support Services Strategy (S3) Related Issues.

The Conference discussed concerns regarding the Banner system.

6. OT-184. Committee on Vice Presidential Search Procedures, Processes for Commenting on the Reappointment of University Officers and (formerly OT-176) Periodic Vice President-Level Reviews. Periodic Vice President-Level Reviews approved by USC 11/28/00; Transmitted to the President 1/19/01. Recommended Principles to be Used in Searches for Major Administrative Positions transmitted to the President 11/14/01; President transmitted to Board of Trustees 11/27/01.

Professor Kaufman reminded the Conference that, when the position of Vice President for Economic Development and Corporate Relations was created, the Conference recommended to the President that the new administrative structure and the performance of the new Vice President should be reviewed not later than the fifth year, in consultation with the Senates Conference. The Conference decided that this should be done around the time of reappointments of University Officers.

7. ST-47. Proposed Revisions to the Statutes -- Multi-Year Contracts for Full-Time Non-Tenured Faculty. Passed UIC Senate 10/27/99. Rejected UIS Senate 3/3/00.

Professor Kaufman reported that the Multi-Year Contracts Task Force met on November 13. He said that there is a renewed interest in Urbana to apply this broadly. He reminded the Conference that it approved statutory language that would have allowed up to a threeyear contract for non-tenured faculty. There were concerns about the broad application of such a policy and the Conference moved in another direction. It created the task force to consider specific categories of faculty, such as clinical. Now the deans and the provost at UIUC would like to adopt this more broadly, and even include academic professionals. Professor Kaufman added that he and Professor Herricks, chair of the task force, plan to consider changes that would be necessary to broaden the proposal. The Conference discussed concerns regarding the dismissal process for those who would be on multi-year contracts. Professor Fossum said that the UIUC Senate had considered procedures for dismissal for cause for academic professionals prior to considering multi-year contracts, because some senate members thought that academic professionals would have more job

security than tenure-track professors if there was not a dismissal process. Professor Kaufman thought that the dismissal process could be outlined in the contract, and suggested consulting Legal Counsel. Professor Fossum said that people need to remember that multi-year contracts are an option, not a requirement. The group discussed how units would determine whether to hire someone on a multi-year contract or as a tenure-track faculty member.

Professor Langley pointed out that the proposal that went to the Board of Trustees was not for insurance coverage, but rather a reimbursement program. She said that this is fine for healthy people but does not work for people who have become uninsurable. She added that the reimbursement program would clearly be inadequate and would not put same-sex domestic partners on the same footing as married partners. She did say, however, that it would be a beginning.
