Professor Weuve called the meeting to order at 10:06 a.m.

I. <u>Meeting with President Killeen and Executive Vice President Jones</u>
President Killeen and EVP Jones joined the meeting from the I Hotel & Conference Center.

### **Motion for Executive Session**

At 10:06 a.m. Professor Li made a motion to hold an executive session to discuss University Employment or other related items. The motion was seconded by Professor Tolliver. No discussion. A roll call vote was taken and the motion to enter an executive session was approved. The executive session began at 10:08 a.m.

II. Executive Session with President Killeen and Executive Vice President Jones

Executive Session Adjourned at 11:01 a.m. and the regular meeting resumed.

EVP Jones provided background information on the proposed DPI Code of Conduct and will speak more about it at the USC Meeting on April 18. The plan is to request delegation authority from the University of Illinois Board of Trustees in July. When Title IX Regulations are released, it will need to be updated. The

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document is being shared with USC for input, not approval.

## III. Meeting with Vice President Walsh – 11:00 a.m.

VP Walsh joined the meeting from the I Hotel & Conference Center and provided a PowerPoint. Insight on the Illinois Innovation Network (IIN) and Discovery Partners Institute (DPI) was shared. Discussion was held on funding and projects. Most of the funding for IIN is external. VP Walsh spoke about Illinois Broadband and advanced manufacturing. The System involvement with IIN is demonstrated by a convening and facilitating role. VP Walsh spoke about the opportunities in Illinois.

President Killeen mentioned that IIN is about developing networks. Reputation is part of the impact. The State Department is seeing how Illinois is connecting the emerging technology.

USC suggested that IIN focus on sharing the story about the efforts.

Professor Weuve expressed appreciation to President Killeen, EVP Jones, and VP Walsh for attending.

The meeting recessed for lunch at 12:00 p.m. and resumed at 1:03 p.m.

## IV. Meeting with Chancellor Jones – 1:00 p.m.

Chancellor Jones joined USC from the I Hotel and Conference Center. Professor Weuve welcomed him. Chancellor Jones mentioned the large amount of travel catching up on opportunities that were not possible due to the COVID-19 Pandemic. He has traveled to Singapore, Tiawan, South Africa, Vietnam, Japan, and Israel. It's critically important to reconnect around the world. The deep reciprocal beneficial relationships allow the exchange of faculty. There are plans to travel to Brazil this fall.

Chancellor Jones spoke about Boldly Illinois. He also expanded on the importance of telling the story of UIUC better than in the past. Internally, a great job has been done, but externally there is work to do to tell others the amazing stories of UIUC. To assist with this effort, UIUC has created their first marketing and branding team. Additionally, Chancellor Jones spoke about operational excellence and utilization of resources. Looking at Illinois Human Resources and Information Technology, how is UIUC meeting the state of the art needs of faculty and staff?

The number of applications is the highest in UIUC's history, at almost 74,000. This is a 4% increase from last year. There will be a need to increase the number of students admitted due to the demand. While some are questioning the value of higher education, that does not appear to be the case at UIUC. There is a higher than ever demand for an Illinois Degree. With the challenges of the new FASFA Form creating confusion, UIUC has pushed back the decision day from May 1 to May 15 to help the families make better decisions.

The SCOTUS decision has impacted recruiting and retaining a diverse student

body. UIUC spends about 50 million dollars more than in 2016.

Chancellor Jones spoke about the Illinois Commitment which will be used by 30% of UIUC Students. He questioned why there are not more students from Southern Illinois. He also spoke about the need to double PELL and remarked it needed to be \$13,000 not to leave anyone behind.

Chancellor Jones spoke about the Carle Illinois College of Medicine which began with 32 students from 1100 applications. Now there are 64 students from almost 3000 applications. Three classes have graduated now. Students are getting placed in some of the best places in the nation. All of them attained their first choice. Chancellor Jones advised the need to obtain state support for the Carle Illinois College of Medicine.

Chancellor Jones spoke positively about our strong shared governance. He also spoke about the big innovative ideas from Illinois that have an influence throughout the world.

Professor Weuve expressed appreciation to Chancellor Jones for attending.
